#### **COURSE DESCRIPTIONS AND INSTRUCTORS**

#### A. Division: Biblical Studies 100

**104** – *Translations of the Bible: How to Decide Which One to Use* – Students will review and compare 10 translations of the Bible and determine the pros and cons of using each for Bible reading and/or study.
