2020 Census Self-Response Weekly Highlights



NORTHWEST GEORGIA TEAM

Personal Community Safety Checks Include Census Assistance within NRFU Tracts

Henry County Government is organizing strike teams to go door to door in six low responding census tracts in the county this week. The Complete Count Committee Chair, who is also the head of emergency management for the county, trained the strike team to conduct quality checks on residents by asking questions about general well-being, COVID safety, functioning fire detectors, etc. Additionally, at the end of each visit, team members will ask residents if they have completed the 2020 Census. Based on the answer, they will either walk them through the process or congratulate them with a small promotional item as a thank you. They have also erected Census tables in some government buildings with a laptop and swag items to encourage anyone who comes in to respond.

Coweta Counts NRFU Parade

The Northwest Georgia partnership specialists teamed up with the Coweta County Sheriff's department, Central Educational Center, and the city of Newnan on August 27th to parade through hard to count census tracts within the city of Newnan. The small but mighty 5-mile car parade helped increase the county response rate above 70%. Members of the partnership team engaged the community by passing out census materials and swag while practicing social distancing.

Omega Psi Phi Fraternity Helps Promote the 2020 Census

The National Pan Hellenic Council of Greater Atlanta (NPHC) is a valued partner of the U.S. Census Bureau and has committed to spreading awareness and increasing participation in the 2020 Census. The NPHC is composed of nine (Divine 9) international Greek-letter sororities and fraternities including Omega Psi Phi Fraternity. The Eta Omega Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity assisted the city of South Fulton with their Drive-Thru Food Distribution at Welcome All Park, organized by Councilwoman Helen Z. Willis. The fraternity distributed food and Census materials, and registered residents to vote. Census Response Representatives assisted participants in completing their Census questionnaire. Atlanta Chinese Life Highlights 2020 Census Asian Week of Action

Atlanta Chinese Life (www.atlanta.americanchineselife.com), the most popular Chinese language online news outlet in Atlanta, highlighted the 2020 Census Asian Week of Action in its news publication. The news article refers to this last period before September 30, 2020 as the “final sprint of the 2020 Census response race.” The article highlights why participating in the 2020 Census is important to the community. It calls upon Chinese residents in Atlanta to respond before the end of Census self-response on September 30, 2020. It reminds residents that to save taxpayers’ money and avoid Census enumerators knocking on their doors, it is best to self-respond either by filling out the paper questionnaire, going to the Census website or calling the Chinese language phone number.

Georgia Filipino Leaders Encourage Community to Self-Respond

In conjunction with the 2020 Census Asian Week of Action, Makabayan Georgia, Georgia Filipino 2020 Census Complete Count Committee, and other Filipino community leaders conducted Census outreach at the local Filipino restaurant, Kuya’s Food Express. The organizers and volunteers promoted the 2020 Census and provided help to anyone who had questions and/or needed assistance with responding to the questionnaire. These community leaders also distributed 2020 Census swag items and information to attendees. The aim of this event was to inform the Filipino community that 2020 Census is still ongoing and that it is not too late to respond online, by phone, or by mail.

CCC Representatives Go Car-by-Car at Food Distribution Sites

Representatives from the Athens-Clarke County Complete Count Committee (CCC) attended food distributions sites around the county and went car-by-car to encourage people to fill out their Census while residents were waiting in line. CCC Representatives distributed Census giveaways and were able to answer questions from residents about the 2020 Census.

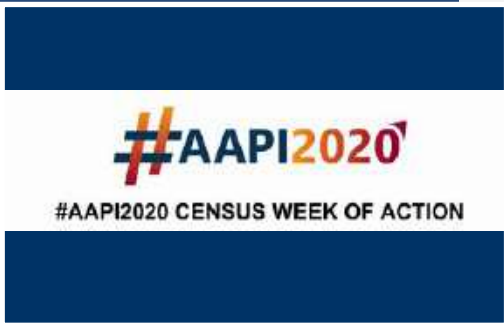
Soul Food Cypher Encourages Urban Males to Complete the 2020 Census

On August 23, 2020, Soul Food Cypher, a Freestyle Cypher which brings MC’s, DJ’s, and music lovers together every 4th Sunday, hosted a virtual segment promoting the 2020 Census. The radio show attracts urban males from across the country ages 18-40. Partnership Specialist Alex Lima spoke during the townhall about how the 2020 Census impacts communities of color. As of August 26, 2020, the townhall had 540 views and 118 shares. Soul Food Cypher also created a music video entitled “Count The Point” which is currently circulating on social media and Spotify.

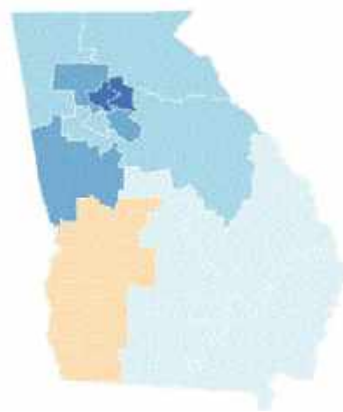

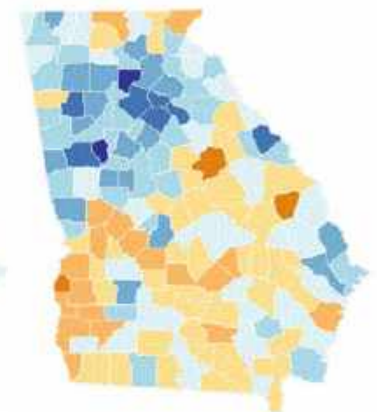

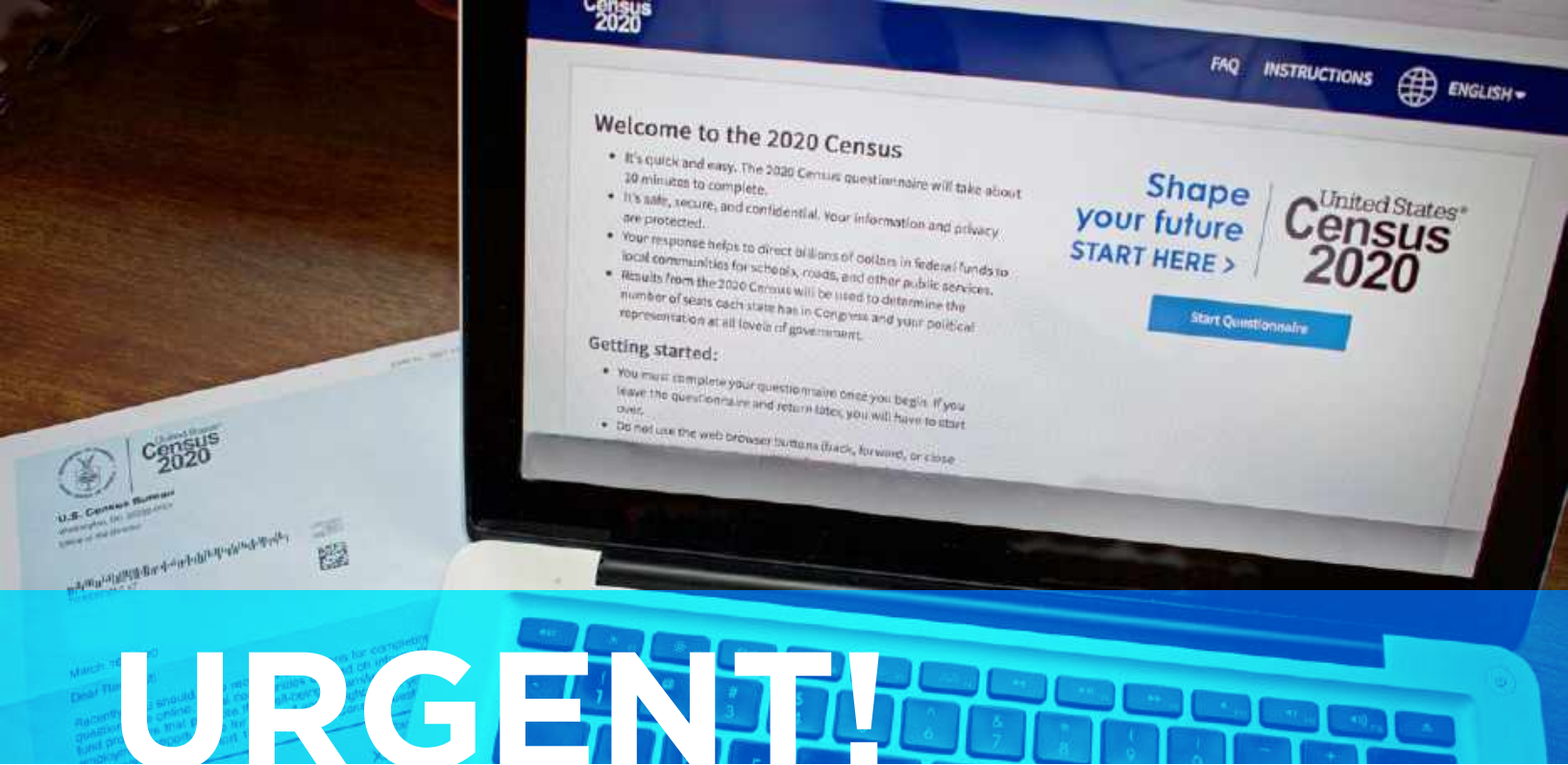

Respond to the Census TODAY!

Time is running out to complete the 2020 Census and the state of Georgia stands to lose hundreds of millions of dollars in federal funding over the next 10 years if you aren't counted.

HOW TO IDENTIFY A CENSUS TAKER

To Ensure EVERYONE is counted, Census takers are visiting households that have not yet responded to the 2020 Census to collect their responses in person.



PPE MASK

All Census takers are required to wear a PPE mask.



2020 CENSUS BADGE

Census employees will possess an authentic work badge with logo and employee's name.



2020 CENSUS PHONE

Census employees will possess an iPhone® with Census logo on back.



U.S. CENSUS TOTE BAG

Census employees will carry a tote bag with the Census logo on it.

If no one is home, Census takers will leave a Notice of Visit with info on how to respond.
